

## PREPARING FOR THE LONG HAUL

Getting ready for the long haul is no easy task. Preparing our mini horse and/or ponies for the long haul is most important. A trainer had told me many years ago when getting ready for your trip, you should start giving your horses more of a gruel - using 3 or 4 alfalfa cubes soaked in water with a small amount of mineral oil in this with your grain on top of this twice a day. This will help with hydrating your horse and lubricating your horses gut with the small amount to help prevent colic along the way on your trip. While traveling, have a bag or hay net of hay for your horse to munch on while traveling. Also have water available either in the trailer with a hanging bucket or by making stops to offer water every few hours as horses can easily become dehydrated - which we usually do anyway for gas and potty stops as well as the need to stretch our legs and eat. These are always good times to check on horses and offer water. If possible, carry water from home so there won't be changes in the taste of the water. Also very important you should encounter any traffic tie-ups or suffer a mechanical breakdown.

Make sure the trailer will provide adequate ventilation during the trip to prevent your horses from overheating. If your trailer is so equipped for hauling in hot weather, use the air conditioning during hauling in hot weather.

When going on a long haul, consider what position does your horse like to be hauled in - straight in or standing on a slant. Some trailers don't give much choice other than straight in as in a two horse trailer. There are many trailer designs to choose from when purchasing a trailer. Most trailers have slant loads. A lot of horses prefer to be standing at a 45 degree slant as they seem to haul better when standing at an angle. A lot of people will wrap their horses legs with standing bandages or with shipping boots to protect against leg injuries. This also helps to keep legs clean when hauling to the horse shows. If a horse likes to stand with his rump against the trailer wall, a tail wrap may help to prevent from any rubbing injuries to your horses tail. When tying your horse, you will want to ensure that the length of tie allows your horse to lower its head vertically. Tying a horse's head too tightly interferes with proper respiratory and sinus drainage and can lead to life-threatening pneumonia.

And since accidents and unexpected illnesses can occur, always carry an emergency medical kit. This should include phenylbutazone (Bute), bandages and gauze, vet wrap, bandage scissors, alcohol, electrolytes, Banamine, eye wash, thermometer, stethoscope and antiseptic ointment. Another suggestion would be to have sanitary napkins for deep wounds for a compression bandage and light day or panty liners for smaller wounds. There are many other items that can be added to your 'Vet Kit' and a person should tailor this to you needs. Pure lube eye ointment is not an antibiotic ointment but can help with easing an eye irritation; a syringe for flushing a wound; a pen and paper to write down information (pulse, heartbeat, respiration, temperature and any other notes in case of injury or illness) are just a few items.

## Root Beer Float Cake with Root Beer White Fluff Icing

### Ingredients:

#### Cake

1 box white cake mix  
3 eggs  
1/2 c sour cream  
1 C root beer  
1 tsp root beer concentrate  
1/2 tsp vanilla  
1/2 C oil

#### Icing

3 Tbsp water  
3 Tbsp white corn syrup  
2/3 C sugar  
2 egg whites  
3/4 tsp root beer concentrate  
1 tsp vanilla

### Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and gather ingredients.
2. Mix cake mix with the 6 remaining ingredients
3. Pour into a greased and floured Bundt cake pan.
4. Bake for 50 min.
5. Let cool.
6. FOR ICING: Bring water, white corn syrup and sugar to a boil and cook until 235 degrees or the sugar syrup threads. Begin to test the syrup at 225 degrees.
7. Take a spoonful of the syrup and dip the spoon in a bowl of cold water. Tip the spoon to see if it releases a thin thread of syrup. If it threads, it's ready to take off of the heat. If it drips instead of threading, it needs to boil a little more. You want the sugar syrup to spin a 6-8 inch thread.
8. As soon as the sugar syrup starts boiling, start beating the egg whites on medium speed. When the syrup threads, remove it from the heat. Turn the mixer to high speed and pour a thin stream of the syrup into the beating egg whites.
9. Beat continually until frosting is stiff and glossy. Add vanilla and root beer concentrate.
10. Continue to beat until mixed well.
11. Spread on cooled cake.
12. Enjoy! Don't forget to share..

## Pumpkin Crunch Cake

Fall is coming and so are the pumpkins. Here is a yummy cake for the season.

### Ingredients:

1 Box yellow cake mix	1 tsp cinnamon
1 can (15 oz) pumpkin puree	1/2 tsp salt
1 can (12 oz) evaporated milk	1 1/2 cups chopped pecans
3 large eggs	1 cup butter, melted
1 1/2 cups sugar	

### Directions:

Heat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease bottom of 9 x13" pan. Mix pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar, cinnamon, and salt. Pour mixture into greased pan. Sprinkle dry cake over pumpkin mixture and top with pecans. Drizzle melted butter over pecans. Bake 50 - 55 minutes.
